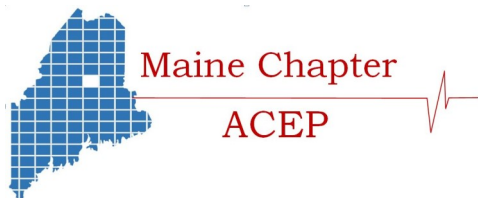




Emergency Medicine Leadership Summit 2023

Thom Mayer, MD, FACEP, FAAP, FACHE Dr. Mayer is Medical Director for the NFL Players Association, Executive Vice President for Leadership, LogixHealth, and Clinical Professor of Emergency Medicine at George Washington University. He was Command Physician at the Pentagon on 9/11; Leadership of the NFL's concussion crisis and author of the NFL's concussion protocols; and author of the book "Battling Healthcare Burnout" (c) 2021.
